FOUR TIPS FOR FIRST TIME VOTERS

BRING IDENTIFICATION

New voters must present an approved photo ID or a non-photo ID at the polling place.



SOME EXAMPLES OF APPROVED IDENTIFICATION INCLUDE: DRIVERS LICENSE, GOVERNMENT ISSUED ID, PASSPORT, SCHOOL ID, EMPLOYMENT ID, FIREARM PERMIT, CURRENT UTILITY BILL, OR CURRENT PAYCHECK.

DO SOME HOMEWORK IN ADVANCE




- Make sure you know where your polling place is located. Visit <u>WWW.PAVOTERSERVICES.PA.GOV</u>.
