Lycoming County Receives Road and Bridge Safety Improvement Award

For the second straight year, Lycoming County was named the winner of the Road and Bridge Safety Improvement Award Program, presented by PennDOT and the Pennsylvania Highway Information Association (PHIA). Representatives from Lycoming County received the award at the CCAP Annual Conference in Gettysburg.

Lycoming County was recognized for its Bridge Bundling Program, which has reduced the number of poor condition local bridges by nearly half while

minimally impacting municipal budgets.

The award recognizes the best road safety or bridge improvement projects undertaken across the state. All entries are graded in four categories: Safety, Resource Innovation, Benefits of Improvements, and Cooperation

America250PA was established in 2018 to coordinate the commemoration of the 250th anniversary of the founding of the United States and Pennsylvania's integral role in that event.

Pennsylvania's 67 counties have had a significant impact on our commonwealth and nation's history, from our oldest counties – Philadelphia, Bucks and Chester, created in 1682 – to our youngest county – Lackawanna, instituted in 1878. Pennsylvania is the first state in the nation where all counties have signed resolutions partnering with America250PA.
