We often emphasize that CCAP's Insurance Programs are owned and governed by the members of the program, and it really is true! Here are the statistics for 2022:

- There are seven insurance programs which provide services to Pennsylvania counties (see the list at the end of this article).
- 72 county and county-related entity representatives serve on the boards and committees which oversee these programs.
- There are 45 counties which have representatives on one or more of the seven insurance boards.
- · Every Pennsylvania county participates in at least one of CCAP's insurance programs!

Hot Topics - Underwriting

You've probably heard this insurance term before. It is a very old term, but what does it mean? In it's earliest form, it meant agreeing to cover a risk. Insurance, as we know it, started in London where ship captains were waiting at port for their ships and cargo to return. In the 1600's there was no way to know when, or if, they would return, and if their valuable cargo would be intact. So, the captains decided to band together with a fund of money, to equally share the losses that would happen, and they wrote their names after each other on their agreement, writing one name under the other.

These days underwriting continues, and it still is the process of deciding whether or not to accept a risk, and if so, at what price. And here's the crucial point of underwriting – the decision is based on data. And the insured – and in the case of CCAP's Insurance Programs – the members – have to provide good, reliable data in order for us to underwrite.

This good data does two things – it tells us the what the member has (number of buildings, how many employees, vehicles, programs, etc.) and their values. The type and number of things gives us a picture of the risk involved, and the values helps us understand what the potential loss cost could be.

So as you provide us with application information, please continue to take it seriously – because if we miss something – and that's were a claim happens – the results could be not enough coverage to pay for the loss, or in a worst case scenario, a loss that is not covered.

By the way – those ship captains I mentioned earlier – they were waiting at John Lloyd's tea shop. And their practice led to the creation of Lloyd's of London.
