## **A RESOLUTION**

A resolution of the county of \_\_\_\_\_\_, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, supporting the 2025 priorities of the County Commissioners Association of Pennsylvania.

**WHEREAS**, Pennsylvania counties have selected three priority issues that will be the focal point of counties' proactive agenda for 2025; and

**WHEREAS**, these priorities showcase counties' commitment to the core services they provide to the people and communities of Pennsylvania; and

**WHEREAS**, achieving these three county priorities underscore the critical need to redefine, reinvigorate and emphasize the state-county partnership in service delivery; and

**WHEREAS**, the top priority for Pennsylvania counties in 2025 is once again securing **911** surcharge reauthorization and statute updates; and

**WHEREAS**, current 911 funding revenues have not kept pace with the increasing costs of the system, which must support our needs into the future, including planning, development and support of Next Gen 911; and

**WHEREAS,** counties are urging swift reauthorization of the 911 surcharge well in advance of its January 31, 2026, sunset date.

**WHEREAS**, counties are also advocating for discussions among policymakers and stakeholders regarding an increase in the surcharge to address the rising annual costs of the 911 system. These costs include expenses related to personnel, cybersecurity, and the long-term capital projects necessary for counties to ensure the system's reliability and sustainability; and

**WHEREAS**, achieving this priority would ensure all Pennsylvania residents and visitors will continue to have a quick and efficient connection to a 911 operator and services in any situation, regardless of geographic location or time of day; and

WHEREAS, counties' second priority is advocating for adequate county mental health base funding increase to ensure that residents are able to access the care that they need; and

**WHEREAS**, counties provide community-based mental health services, such as community residential programs, family-based support, outpatient care and crisis intervention, which are critical to the well-being of our constituents and our communities; and

<b>WHEREAS,</b> counties third priority continues to be seeking critical vote-by-mail reforms, including clarifications to current law surrounding drop boxes and ballot curing, as well as expanded pre-canvassing time and moving back the mail-in ballot application deadline to 15 days before an election; and
<b>WHEREAS,</b> achieving this priority would give counties needed tools to run fair, secure, and accurate elections, restoring public trust in the election system; therefore, be it
<b>RESOLVED</b> , that County stands ready to work with the County Commissioners Association of Pennsylvania and counties throughout the commonwealth in support of these priorities for 2025; and be it further
<b>RESOLVED</b> , that these priorities emphasize the important role County plays in improving our communities and the well-being of our residents; and
<b>RESOLVED</b> , that County calls upon the General Assembly and the Administration to work together in partnership with counties to jointly determine the most effective ways to continue meeting the needs of Pennsylvanians; and
<b>RESOLVED</b> , collaboration between county government and the commonwealth on these priorities will lead to solutions that improve stewardship of taxpayer dollars, reduce cost, increase local flexibility and assure the quality of services counties provide; and
<b>RESOLVED</b> , that a copy of this resolution be sent to the County legislative delegation, to Governor Shapiro, and to the County Commissioners Association of Pennsylvania.
